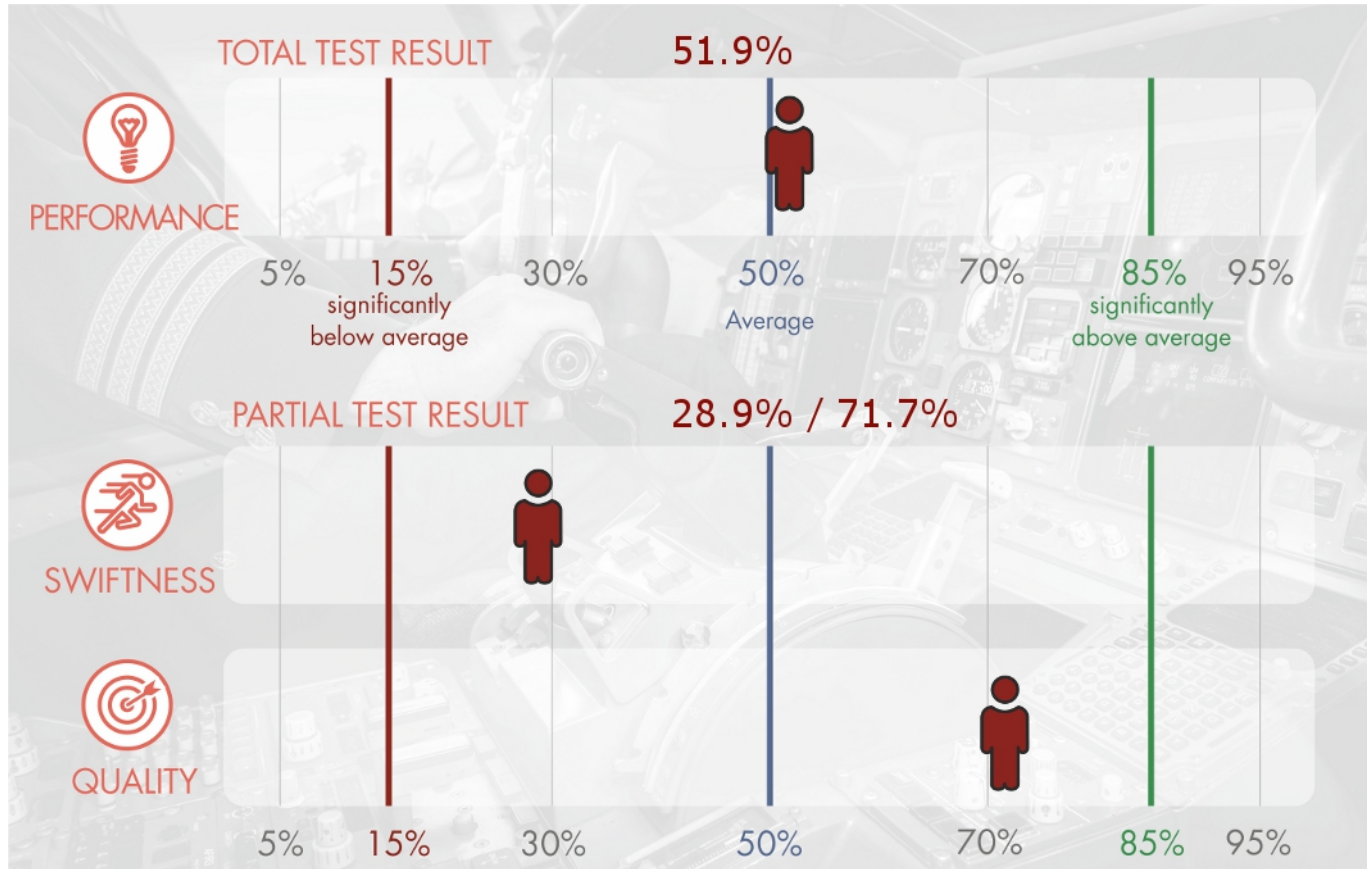

These are the results of the Press Test mapping your ability of sharp, flexible judgement, as well as your ability to decide quickly even in non-standard situations. Time pressure is purposely exercised during the test and the respondent must work with various types of information (abstract, verbal, numeric, visual), adapt to changing conditions and apply various styles of problem-solving.

OVERALL TEST RESULTS

The test outcome comprises evaluation of the overall success in the test and also comparison of the speed and quality of problem-solving with the reference group.



Note: The chart shows results of the individual sub-tests in the form of attained percentiles. Percentiles enable comparison with the referential group and show how many percent of people attained a worse result in the same test. The value of 50% represents an average result, the range from 30% to 70% is considered as the wider average zone. The referential group comprises working population with at least secondary-school education and does not correspond with the general population.

The PERFORMANCE scale describes the overall result of each respondent in the test, i.e. how many tasks he/she resolved correctly in the given time limit.

The SWIFTNESS scale describes how many tasks the respondent managed to resolve in the given time limit, regardless of their correctness.

The QUALITY scale describes the portion of correctly resolved tasks compared to all tasks resolved by the respondent.

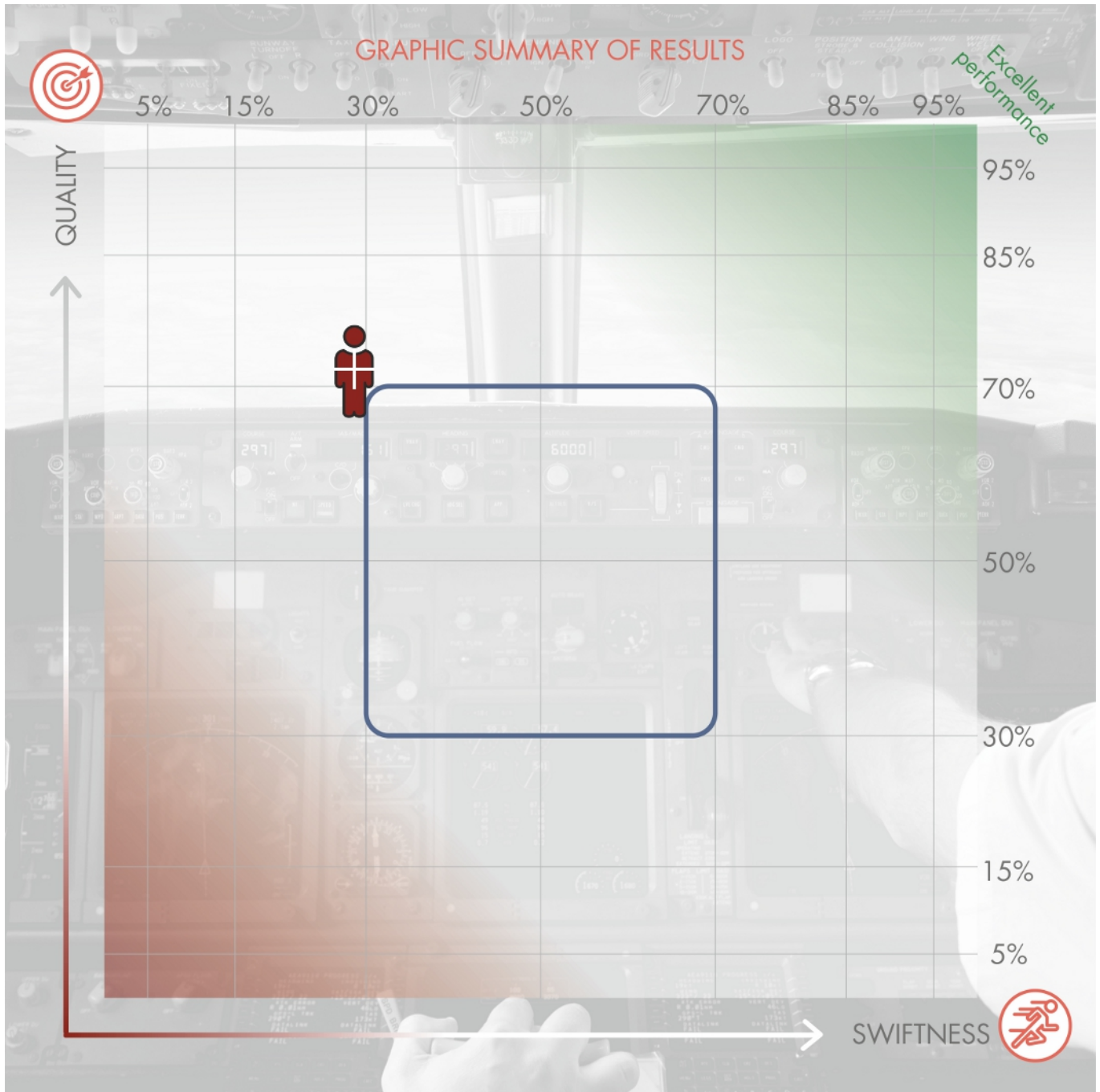
INTERPRETATION

The overall result in this test is in the zone of upper average.

The resulting level of speed in problem-solving is rather lower when more demanding problems occur. People attaining this level are usually not reckless, they act prudently and do not make premature decisions. Time pressure is not very good for them as it can decrease their concentration and speed. In practice it can therefore be suitable for them if they have enough time, mainly to think over more complicated tasks.

The attained results are in the above-average zone of quality of solutions. People with these results can focus on the substance and also on significant details; they can precisely and carefully assess information of various type and find logically correct solutions. They generally have a good ability to attain high-quality performance under pressure and disturbing conditions.

SWIFTNESS AND QUALITY OF SOLUTIONS



Note: The chart captures the overall result attained in the test, regarding the quality and speed of solutions, in the form of percentiles.

The test outcomes can differentiate between people who prefer a slower, more systematic and continuous style of work (where quality and accuracy is more desirable than speed) and people who can solve their tasks quickly with an insight, but sometimes to the detriment of accuracy and therefore possibly with an increased number of mistakes (speed is preferred at the expense of quality).
